







## The Value and Limitations of Word Studies

## Context and Usage

ROM 7:25 -8:4 Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, on the one hand I myself with my mind am serving the <u>law</u> of God, but on the other, with my flesh the <u>law</u> of sin. Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the <u>law</u> of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the <u>law</u> of sin and of death. For what the <u>Law</u> could not do, weak as it was through the flesh, God did: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh, so that the requirement of the <u>Law</u> might be fulfilled in us, who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

## **Conflicting Contexts?**

ROM 12:19-21 Never take your own revenge, beloved, but leave room for the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is Mine, I will repay," says the Lord. "But if your enemy is hungry, feed him, and if he is thirsty, give him a drink; for in so doing you will heap burning coals on his head." Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.
